Senior Secondary Education

- Students are moving into a new and exciting phase – greater choice and freedoms – and increased personal responsibility
- The Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) provides a challenging senior secondary program and allows students to work in areas suited to their strengths and interests
- The WACE requirements and processes the College must follow are determined by the School Curriculum and Standards Authority
- This section will take you through the key features and requirements of the WACE.



WASSA – All students

All students receive a Western Australian Statement of Student Achievement (WASSA) when they complete Year 12.

The WASSA:

- formally records a student's achievement in every course, qualification and program that the student has completed in senior secondary schooling
- provides evidence of achievement.



The WACE

The Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) is awarded to students who have successfully completed senior secondary schooling in WACE studies and have met the WACE requirements.

The majority of students in Western Australia achieve the WACE.





WACE requirements

Students must:

- complete one of three course combination options
- ✓ complete at least four Year 12 ATAR courses* OR
- ✓ complete at least five Year 12 General courses and/or ATAR courses or equivalent OR
- ✓ complete a Certificate II (or higher) VET qualification in combination with ATAR, General or Foundation courses
- demonstrate the literacy and numeracy standards
- meet the requirements for breadth and depth of study
- meet the achievement standard.



Literacy and numeracy standard requirement

Students must demonstrate minimum standards of literacy and numeracy by either:

- demonstrating the standard through the Online Literacy and Numeracy Assessment (OLNA); or
- pre-qualifying through NAPLAN, by achieving Band 8 or higher in Year 9 testing.

College provide excellent support for student to meet these requirements through our Academic Support Team.

Breadth and depth requirement

Students must complete a minimum of 20 units (10 Courses), including:

- four units from an English learning area course
- one pair of units from List A
- one pair of units from List B.



Achievement standard requirement

Students must achieve 14 C grades or higher (or equivalents) in Year 11 and Year 12 units, including at least six C grades (or equivalents) in Year 12 units.

- Unit = Semester.
- Therefore, a minimum of 7 C grades over Year 11 and 12.

MSC Academic Standards Policy

- All students in Year 11 are required to achieve the minimum standard of **four A, B or C grades** (or equivalent) in four year long courses.
- A 'C' grade equivalent is achieved in VET courses by the achievement of all units of competence.
- Students studying an ATAR pathway need to achieve a minimum predicted ATAR of 65 by the end of Year 11.
- Students who do not meet this minimum academic standard will be expected to move to a General pathway, repeat Year 11 the following year or seek alternative training or employment.

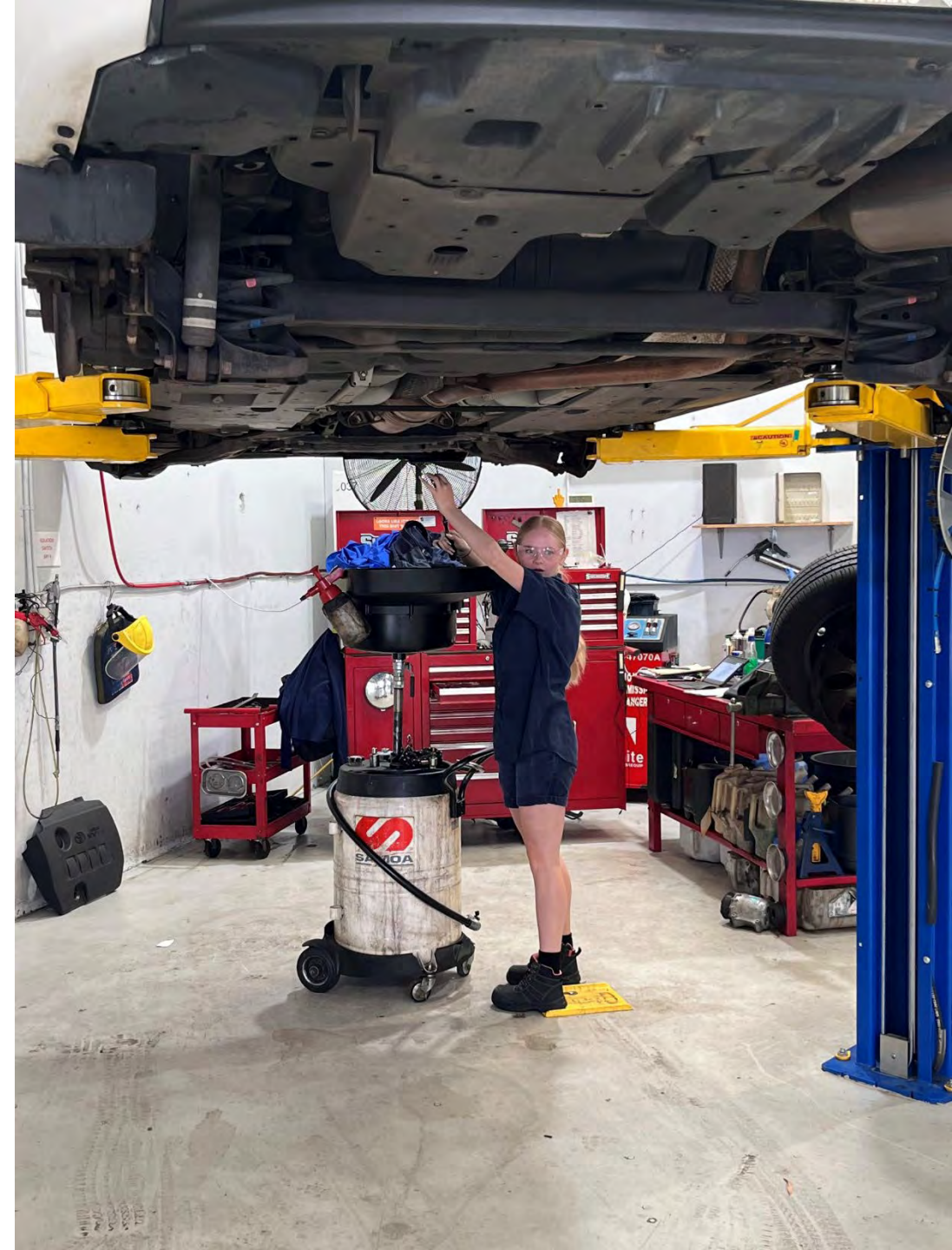

Vocational Education & Training (VET)

- VET is a Certificate course, aiming towards achieving a qualification and is completed outside of the College Campus
- Both TAFE and Private Training Providers offer a range of courses
- These courses are offered to all students in the Metropolitan area and therefore entry into a course is highly competitive
- For the majority of courses selection is based on a student's Year 10 Semester 1 report
- Course information will be available mid term 3 and all parents of students on a General pathway will be emailed the link to access course applications.

How do students get into an EXTERNAL VET Certificate Course?

- Applications to Private RTO are usually a hard copy and then emailed
- Most of these are 'fee for service courses'
- The free courses delivered external to MSC are **HIGHLY COMPETITIVE**

External Vocational Education and Training (VET)

It is important that students and parents understand that if a student chooses to participate in an external VET program, the student will miss classes at MSC. It is a condition of participation that the student keeps up to date with all aspects of their College courses. VET programs count as a course/unit equivalent towards WACE and participating students may be allowed to reduce their course load to give them the greatest opportunity to succeed.

PLEASE NOTE that the College (Tracey Loughnan) needs to be informed of the intention to apply for any of the courses listed below. This can be done at the enrolment interview.
